Dear Jason,

As you are likely aware, PETA has been trying to reach you to clarify Air China's policy on shipping primates to laboratories. Additionally, we have notified our members that Air China is one of the last airlines that still handles shipments of primates to laboratories. We have also encouraged our supporters to contact your company to voice opposition to this inhumane practice.

This morning, Frank notified me that Air China no longer handles shipments of monkeys to laboratories, but I have not received any clear written statement from you or any other Air China representative to that effect.

If Air China has indeed prohibited the transportation of primates to laboratories on any of its flights—as China Southern Airlines and China Airlines have already done—PETA will happily end our campaign activities with regards to your company and notify our members that contact with your company is no longer necessary.

Does Air China policy currently allow for the transportation of primates to laboratories aboard any of its flights, anywhere in the world?
